Directions:

- 1. The Contractor shall provide a hazardous material abatement plan submittal in addition to any hazardous material surveys conducted. Abatement plan and abatement activities shall be IAW UFGS 02 82 00 "Asbestos Remediation" (or other applicable UFGS if hazardous material is other than asbestos).
- 2. The abatement contractor shall obtain a hazardous material removal permit from DPW Environmental Division (ED) and/or Puget Sound Clean Air prior to conducting any abatement activities.
- **3.** Upon completion of hazardous material abatement, the Contractor shall schedule a visual clearance with the Government QAR and PM. (see visual clearance form in subsequent pages). Prior to scheduling a visual clearance, the contractor quality control representative shall verify that an air clearance of the area to be inspected has been completed and the results are satisfactory for the material abated. Example: For asbestos, the air monitoring results shall reveal a fiber concentration in the abated area that is less than pre-abatement activities or less than 0.01 f/cc, whichever is lower.
- **4.** During the project closeout phase, the Contractor shall submit the abatement contractor's fully endorsed hazardous material removal permit, air clearance monitoring results, and hazardous material waste receipt(s) to the Government PM.
- **5.** The Government PM shall forward all documents to DPW ED at the conclusion of the project. The visual clearance documents shall be kept in the project folder for COR/KO review if required.
